ply face shield and start rescue breath-ing Each breath should last 1 second Adult - 1 breath every 5 seconds Child- 1 breath every 3 seconds Infant- 1 breath every 3 seconds Reassess circulation every 2 minutes for no more than 10 seconds If unsure a pulse exists, start CPR Don't waste more critical time searching for a pulse

CPR Guidelines - Infant (Less than 1 year old)

child (approximately 1 breath every 3 to 5 seconds) Healthcare providers delivered 20 breaths per minute for the infant or child Rescue Breaths With Chest Compressions - Infant All rescuers should deliver each rescue breath during CPR over 1 second The volume of each rescue breath should be sufficient to produce visible chest rise

mouth, and given 1 breath (blow for 1 second), watch for the chest to rise If the chest does not rise, make a second attempt to open the airway with a health tilt-chin lift Then give 1 breath (blow over 1 second) and watch for the chest to rise Of course, if using mask barrier device or bag mask ventilation, there is no need to pinch the nose

If an unconscious child or infant is face-down, roll face-up, supporting the head, neck and back in a straight line If ALONE—Give about 2 minutes of CARE, then CALL 9-1-1 If the child or infant responds, CALL 9-1-1 or the local emergency number for any life-threatening conditions and obtain consent to give CARE CHECK the child from

American Heart Association Basic Life Support

- Give 2 breaths (1 second each) • Deliver second cycle of 30 compressions at correct hand position (Acceptable >23 compressions) • Give 2 breaths (1 second each) • Continue CPR until help arrives Push Hard, and Push Fast: compress at a minimum rate of at least 100 compressions per

Normal Breath Sounds Type Description Location Characteristics

Normal Breath Sounds (Kozier 613) Type Description Location Characteristics Vesicular Soft-intensity, low-pitched, “gentle sighing” sounds created by air moving through smaller airways (bronchioles & alveoli) Over peripheral lung; best heard at base of lungs Best heard on inspiration, which is about 25 times longer than the expiratory
